Complete Spanish Pronouns Reference Sheet

Subject Pronouns

I	Yo	(yoh)
You (informal)	Tú	(too)
He	Él	(ehl)
She	Ella	(eh-yah)
You (formal)	Usted	(oos-tehd)
We (m)	Nosotros	(noh-soh-trohs)
We (f)	Nosotras	(noh-soh-trahs)
You all (Spain)	Vosotros	(voh-soh-trohs)
You all (L.A.)	Ustedes	(oos-teh-dehs)
They (m)	Ellos	(eh-yohs)
They (f)	Ellas	(eh-yahs)

Demonstrative Pronouns

This (m/f)	Este / Esta	(ehs-teh / ehs-tah)
That (m/f)	Ese / Esa	(eh-seh / eh-sah)
These (m/f)	Estos / Estas	(ehs-tohs / ehs-tahs)
Those (m/f)	Esos / Esas	(eh-sohs / eh-sahs)

Possessive Pronouns

Mine	Mío / Mía	(mee-oh / mee-ah)
Yours (inf)	Tuyo / Tuya	(too-yoh / too-yah)
His/Hers/Yours(f)	Suyo / Suya	(soo-yoh / soo-yah)
Ours	Nuestro / Nuestra	(nwehs-troh / nwehs-trah)
Theirs	Suyo / Suya	(soo-yoh / soo-yah)

Prepositional Pronouns

For me	Para mí	(pah-rah mee)
With me	Conmigo	(kohn-mee-goh)
For you	Para ti	(pah-rah tee)
With you	Contigo	(kohn-tee-goh)

Usage Tip

In Spanish, subject pronouns (Yo, Tú, etc.) are often **omitted** because the verb ending already tells you who is performing the action.
